Lighting candles is a custom of many religions for several different reasons:


Candles signify love, prayer, passion and hope.

Lighting of candles on Christmas Eve comes from the Jewish "Feast of Lights" or Hanukkah.

Candle light represents Jesus who is the light of the world and who guides us from all the darkness of the world.

The four weeks before Christmas are called the Season of Advent. This is a time when Christians anticipate the birth of Jesus on Christmas Eve. One tradition is to light a candle of the Advent wreath, adding a light each week. The camdles symbolize the Hope, Love, Joy and Peace that is felt as Christians anticpate Jesus' coming. The Christ candle is litton Christmas Eve.

Stars top many Christmas trees symbolizing the Star of Bethlehem, more commonly called the Christmas star. It is mentioned in the Bible as the star which led the three wise men to the small town of Bethlehem, where Jesus was born.




